

Opportunity to Fulfill Great Need for Affordable Senior Housing and Community Space in Brookline



Research Shows:

- Having a sense of attachment to home and community relates positively to physical, social, and emotional health and well-being in older age
- Loneliness is the biggest threat to healthy aging
- Most seniors want to remain in their community

Key Senior Issues in Brookline:

- 20% of the Town's population is over age 60
- 18.3% of people age 65+ have an annual income less than \$20,000
- CCB has 230 seniors on the affordable housing wait list
- Older adult population is growing



Centre Street Campus: Unique Opportunity to Enhance the Senior Living Experience



The Centre Street Campus provides a unique opportunity to redefine and enhance the senior living experience:

- Proximity to the many amenities offered in Coolidge Corner dining, shops, movie theater, bookstore and library, multigenerational activities throughout the day
- Adjacent location to the Brookline Senior Center
- A well-established existing senior residential community offering a wide variety of highquality housing and services at all levels of affordability
- A mission-driven, nonprofit owner with deep and respected experience in senior care



A Vision for the Centre Street Campus



- A dynamic, welcoming, and attractive Senior Hub for the Brookline community
- Expanded community space offering cultural arts, lifelong learning, and multigenerational programs that promote wellness and independence in our vibrant neighborhood
- Redevelopment of the 108 Centre Street site into 54 senior all-affordable independent living apartments in a 7-story building via a 40B; no onsite parking
- Sustainable design pursuing Passive House standards and fossil fuel free design (with exception of domestic hot water) and incorporating highest standards to the greatest extent feasible
- Enhancements to the overall campus, including landscaping, lighting, and green space











Expanded Community Space

 - Café + Exterior Patio
 - Group Exercise
 - Multipurpose Room
- Outdoor Green Space for use by all Brookline Seniors


Number of Caregivers/Aides All CCB Centre Street Buildings February 2021



Key Outcomes – Right Care, Right Place, Right Time (R3) Initiative



- Assessments-condition, wellness, cognition
- Eyes-on and communication with team
- Connection to services
- Education and wellness programs
- Transitions management
- Regular proactive check-ins and follow up
- Ongoing coaching
